ISSUE: Whether to amend Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, as amended, by

amending Parts 6, 15, and 17 of Schedule B to reflect changes approved in Budget 2023, and Part 18 of Schedule B to clarify wording around development

that proceeds without a permit.

RECOMMENDATION:

That By-law No. 5065, a by-law to amend Part 6, Part 15, Part 17, and Part 18 of Schedule B of Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, as amended, be presented for adoption.

BACKGROUND:

Fees and charges are collected, managed, and used in the delivery of programs and services across most City departments; in 2023 they are expected to constitute 24% of the City's overall revenues.

Prior to 2007, user fees and charges were embedded in the individual by-laws associated with the programs and services provided by the City. In 2007, all fees and charges were consolidated into a new by-law, Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, to improve transparency and to simplify the associated administration.

Each spring, Administration conducts an annual review of all Fees and Charges, and based on this review brings forward annual amendments for Council's consideration. Administration also reviews the Fees and Charges By-law each December in the context of budget decisions, and when necessary brings forward amendments in conjunction with the Budget approval.

Budget 2023 maintains Water and Sewer rates at their existing level over the term of the budget and the amending by-law extends the fees through 2025.

Budget 2023 includes changes to the Solid Waste Management User Fees and the Medical Response Fees. These are reflected in the amending by-law being brought forward now for implementation January 1, 2023.

At this time Administration is also recommending that the wording around Development Permit fees be amended to clarify that where development requiring a permit proceeds without one being obtained, the appropriate application fee(s) shall be doubled.

COUNCIL POLICY / RESOLUTION OR GOAL:

Goal # 2 Delivering efficient and accountable government.

APPLICABLE LEGISLATION, BY-LAWS, STUDIES, PLANS:

- 1. Cities, Towns and Villages Act section 72 (e); and
- 2. Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, as amended.

CONSIDERATIONS:

The Medical Response amendment incorporates the Medical Response fee changes included in Budget 2023 into the Fees and Charges By-law.

The Water and Sewer Rates amendment extends the current fees through 2025 to reflect that Budget 2023 maintains these fees at their current level over the term of the budget.

The Solid Waste Management User Fee amendment incorporates the Solid Waste Management User Fee changes included in Budget 2023 into the Fees and Charges By-law.

The Development Permit Fee clarification confirms that when development requiring a permit proceeds without one being obtained, the associated fees will be doubled.

ALTERNATIVES TO RECOMMENDATION:

That Committee direct Administration to propose alternative fees and return to Committee with a revised amending by-law.

RATIONALE:

During Budget 2023 deliberations:

- Council approved changes to the User Fees associated with Medical Response services. The rate changes in this amendment reflect these changes.
- Council approved the recommendation to leave User Fees associated with the Water and Sewer Fund at existing levels. This amendment extends the existing fees through 2025.
- Council approved changes to the User Fees associated with the Solid Waste Management Fund. The rate changes in this amendment reflect these changes.

Zoning By-law No. 5045 removed the requirement for a Development Permit for certain types of development, but where development requiring a permit proceeds without one being obtained, the appropriate application fee will be doubled.

BY-LAW NO. 5065

BM 440

A BY-LAW of the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories, to amend Fees and Charges By-law No. 4436, as amended.

PURSUANT to Sections 70, 72 and 73 of the Cities, Towns and Villages Act, S.N.W.T., 2003, c. 22;

WHEREAS the Council of the Municipal Corporation of the City of Yellowknife wishes to amend By-law No. 4436, as amended, to reflect changes to the fees and charges collected by the City of Yellowknife as set out in the attached Parts of Schedule "A";

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF YELLOWKNIFE, in regular sessions duly assembled, enacts as follows:

APPLICATION

- 1. That By-law No. 4436, as amended, is hereby amended by deleting the following Parts of Schedule "B" and replacing them with the Schedules attached hereto:
 - A. Deleting Part 6 of Schedule "B" of By-law No. 4436, as amended, and replacing with Part 6 of Schedule "A" attached hereto.
 - B. Deleting Part 15 of Schedule "B" of By-law No. 4436, as amended, and replacing with Part 15 of Schedule "A" attached hereto.
 - C. Deleting Part 17 of Schedule "B" of By-law No. 4436, as amended, and replacing with Part 17 of Schedule "A" attached hereto.
 - D. Deleting the general preamble to Part 18 of Schedule "B" of By-law No. 4336, as amended, and replacing with the general preamble of Part 18 of Schedule "A" attached hereto.

EFFECT

2. That this by-law shall come into effect upon receiving Third Reading and otherwise meets the requirements of Section 75 of the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act*.
