

2023 Wildfire and Evacuation

The GMRP implemented the Emergency Control Plan during wildfire evacuation and site was successfully kept secure.

Securing Site and Aiding City

- Fires encroaching; City calls for support from local industry
- Contractors secured site; enabled to help City with personnel and equipment
- Pumps on; keeping water below chambers; equipment moved to tailings ponds;
- Secured site monitored; personnel, equipment loaned to fire suppression efforts; evacuated staff followed situation closely



- Personnel on essential list for re-entry
- Loaned equipment returned
- Water levels checked after 3-week pause
- Contractors extended construction season
- Full effects to project cost/scope under review



Completed and Upcoming Work

What we have accomplished and what is planned next.

Townsite Deconstruction

Work Completed in 2023/24

- Remainder of Townsite Buildings
 deconstructed
- Materials that could be recycled were recycled
- Non-hazardous material that could not be recycled was placed in the onsite nonhazardous landfill
- Asbestos containing material was double bagged (as per regulations) and placed in the onsite non-hazardous landfill




Water Treatment Plant

Work Completed in 2023/24

- Start of construction in 2023:
 - Vegetation Clearing
 - Contaminated Soils Removal (~50% complete)
 - Blasting and Rock Crushing for reuse (~35% complete)
- Pad prepared for WTP building construction
- Mine water intake wells drilled

Upcoming Work

- Finish removing contaminated soils and blasting work
- Construct WTP foundation and building
- Complete the Outfall pipeline and Marine
 Outfall in Yellowknife Bay
- Complete the minewater intake wells and pumps
- Commissioning anticipated 2026

V Underground Stabilization

Work Completed in 2023/24

- Constructed paste backfill barricades
- Installed underground power and remote monitoring cameras

- Ongoing preparatory work for the 2024 paste backfill program
 - Construction work starting in early 2024
 - Paste backfill operations planned to resume in Spring 2024 and completed in Fall 2024

Townsite and Boat Launch

Remediation will impact the boat launch area. GMRP and GNWT are working together to minimize inconvenience to users and keep the public informed.





Townsite Area – Public Use

- Actively managed by GNWT, with sub-leases to the YHS and GSSC
- CIRNAC/GNWT engagement initiatives to ensure the following groups are aware of risks, schedules and other considerations:
 - 1. Larger Boating Community
 - 2. GSSC/ Yacht Club
 - 3. YHS Museum

- Anticipate public notification providing information regarding in-water access routes

- Water Treatment Plant on-going construction
- Outfall installation
- Freshwater intake-water; water trucks for on-site dust management
- Parking and water access as is






GSSC and YHS Area 2028 - 2030


- All access to water will be through existing public boat launch
- No access for GSSC users or the general public
- Soil remediation activities begin
- Near shore sediment rip rap cover activities
- All soil removed and replaced with clean fill


